



- New regulations introduced 2016-2019
- Aiming at moderating growth by limiting stocking based on
 - fish health
 - growth plans
 - environmental indicators
- CAGR of 3.5% last 5 years






Chilean industry: Improving fish health and productivity


Harvest weight and smolt yield

Challenging ocean conditions

- More frequent algae incidents
- More frequent episodes of reduced oxygens levels
- Sea lice: old solution losing efficacy





Acting and preventing

- 2/3 of seawater sites have now state of the art platforms supplying additional oxygen
- All Atlantic sites have upwelling systems mitigating algae effects
- All fish with sea lice protection (Lufenuron and Alfaflux) for up to 3 Kg
- Transitioning from one tool (AZM) to a toolkit of tools
- Introducing new non-pharma solutions
 - Optilicer
 - FLS
 - Salmoclinic
- So far so good: 6Kg Live Weight in Q4






Oxzo upwelling system



Sales distribution by product (%*)











- Decreased short term country growth expectations






